This is Your Course Orientation

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Course Description



- View 20 thirty-minute telecourse episodes of "real life" in-home interactions between parents and children with interview sequences in which a counselor discusses with parents the application of principles and skills for improving typical situations and relationships.
- A *Viewer's Guide* includes a summary, learning objectives, and principles illustrated for each of the twenty episodes.
- Complete Episode Observation Forms (20 brief written assignments) and upload them to moodle.
- Complete a Parent Objectives Form one time and upload to moodle.
- Take 3 multiple-choice exams (on moodle)

Course Objectives

- Learn a relationship-oriented approach to understand parent-child dynamics;
- Identify strengths in parent-child interactions and relationships, as well as areas for improvement;
- Use an effective approach to child discipline and guidance through kind and firm action rather than reminding, arguing, explaining, or negotiating;
- Establish parental credibility without punishment, manipulation, or threats;
- Improve communication and encouragement skills;
- Strengthen order, structure, and routine;
- Set reasonable rules and limits and follow through consistently;
- Stimulate independence, self-reliance, and responsibility.

Episode Observation form


- Forms are due with each exam.
