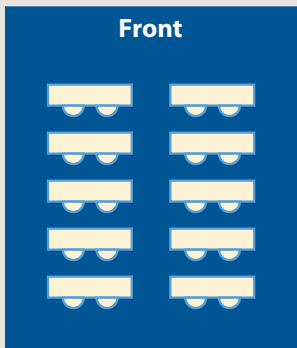


Classroom

Front

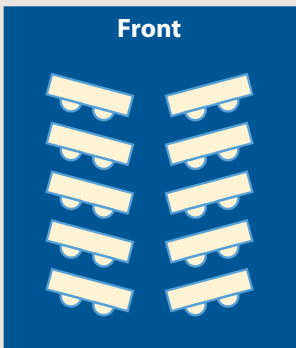


Uses: Educational setting with a presenter.

Front

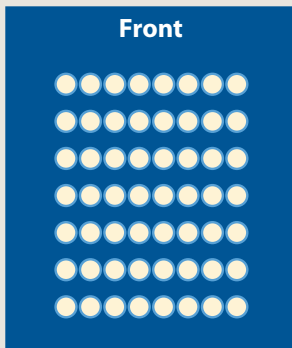


Uses: Educational setting with a presenter.

Front

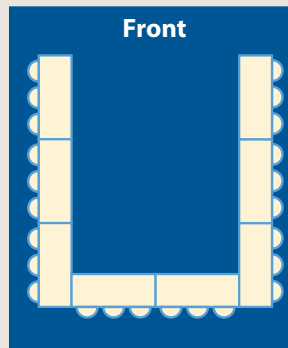


Uses: Meetings without the need for writing tables. Can also be Chevron style.

Front

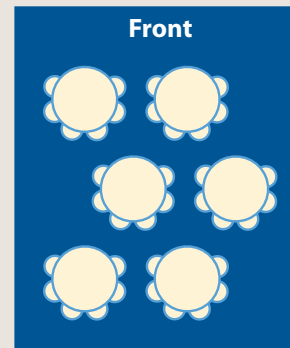


Uses: For presentations and open discussions - up to 40 people.

Crescent Rounds

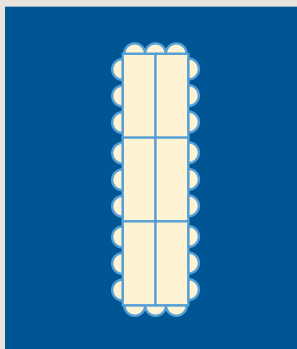
Front

Features: Attention is focused to the front of room.

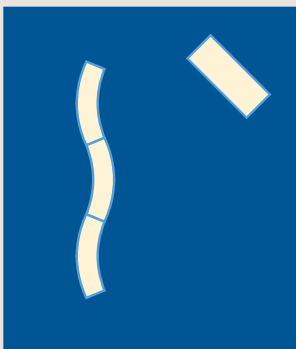
Conference (Boardroom)



Uses: Small meetings with open discussion for 4 to 20 people.

Features: Intimate meetings with plenty of table space.

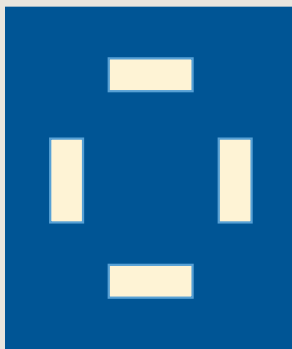
Reception



Uses: Open space for mingling, with table for food and a bar.

Features: Space is open and versatile. Tables come with coverings and skirts.

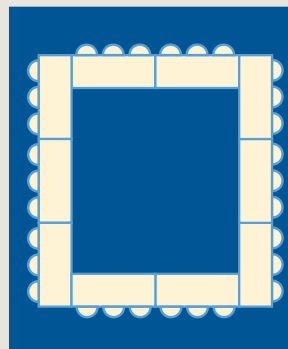
Exhibit



Uses: Vendor exhibits, silent auctions, & faires.

Features: Space is open and versatile. Tables come with coverings and skirts.

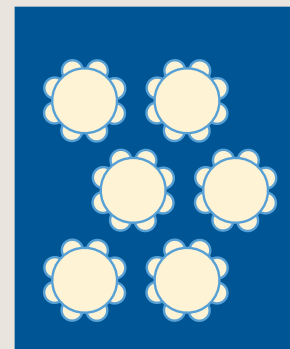
Hollow Square



Uses: Promotes open discussion for groups up to 46.

Features: Larger than Conference style.

Features: Attention is focused on other participants.
