2. APPLICATION PROCESS & DATES

The following information is intended for program entrance only and does not include information on courses required for degree completion. These can be found in the catalog listing for the program year 2011-2012.

2A. Selection Criteria.

Apply early, the program fills up quickly. Program admission is based on first applied and qualified, first admitted. Application date/time is recorded upon submission. Note: Testing must be completed prior to Application submission.

The program is limited to 72 students. In addition, there will be 6 designated alternates. An alternate is allowed to enter the program if an admitted student declines. Remaining alternates are given admission priority the following session.

3. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Application. To apply to this program, you must complete and submit the following by the closing date listed above. Details of requirements are provided in the following sections.

- Be admitted to Lane Community College as a college-credit student and have an L number
- Meet Minimum Placement Testing Requirements (no exceptions)
- Complete the Program Application.
- Following submission of your application, you may be called for an interview. Failure to appear will result in an incomplete application and will not be considered.

4. APPLICATION WORKSHEET & REQUIRED STEPS

Use this check list to make sure you complete all requirements. Review Application Process and Dates Section. Keep this check list as a reference.

1. E-mail Account. You will need to obtain an E-mail address if you do not already have one. Lane's Enrollment Services and Culinary Arts and Hospitality Management Department use E-mail to send information. It is your responsibility to set your "spam filter" system to accept mail addresses containing @lanecc.edu . Do this even if you are currently receiving E-mails from Lane. We cannot be responsible for notices which are not received due to spam or junk mail handling.

2. Admission to Lane as a <u>credit</u> student. If you are not currently a <u>credit</u> Lane student, complete Lane's college admission process and obtain a student "L" number at <u>http://www.lanecc.edu/es/admissions.html</u>. Make sure to complete all "<u>Steps to Enroll in Credit Classes</u>" including testing. Declare Culinary Arts as your Major.

_____3. Testing. New Students - You <u>must</u> take the following tests to be considered for the program. <u>No</u> exceptions*. Testing must be completed prior to submission of the Application.

DEMANDS OF THE PROGAM

It is important to recognize that the Culinary Arts and Hospitality Management fields are exciting, fast-paced and typically involve a high degree of mental and physical demands. Applicants to either of Lane's programs can expect that the curriculum will match the demanding nature of these service professions.

At the time of entry into the program, students are expected to be able to communicate well verbally and in writing, calculate basic math and simple algebra problems, and with practice, learn to extend recipes quickly at the time of planning and food preparation. Lab sessions last six hours, and students are typically standing for extended periods of time. Some food and equipment are heavy or involve safety risks (such as knives) and require lifting or agile movement. All students will be expected to work gracefully and communicate clearly under intense time pressures for specific events.

In order to successfully complete these programs, students must meet the established academic requirements that are essential to the program of instruction, with or without reasonable accommodations.

5. NOTIFICATION

Notification of your status will be announced on the 1st and 15th of every month starting June 1, 2011.

6. Fall 2011 ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

If accepted or considered an alternate to the program, you must complete the following. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of program eligibility.

- Attend the Mandatory Orientation. Both accepted and alternate students must attend the orientation session to be eligible for the program. Date and location will be announced in notification of program acceptance.
