### HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

- Lane has admitted international students since it was founded.
- Over time Lane developed separate programs for international English Language Learners and college credit students.
- International student numbers peaked in the late 1990s and then began to fall after the Asian Economic Crisis and the fallout of the changes made to student visas after September 11.
- Lane has traditionally had intern work abroad opportunities and a few study abroad courses such as Joe Russin's Biology in Costa Rica course.

### EXPANSION OF INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

- Strategic directions of liberal education, fiscal sustainability, and Diversity.
- In 2010 a nationwide search for an international program manager.
- By 2020 international programs will:
  - Serve 1,000 international students from at least
     45 countries
  - Assist with 10 affordable faculty led study abroad programs.
  - Have sister colleges for exchange in 5-7 countries.

#### INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PROFILE

#### Spring 2011

- 2.74 Average Spring GPA
- 28% of our students are in academic difficulty (less than a 2.0 GPA or completing less than 12 credits)
- 32% high academic achievement (more than 12 credits completed and higher than a 3.0 GPA)
- 40% average academic progress (12 credits completed and a 2.0-2.9 GPA)
- Less than 10% complete a Lane degree.

#### • Goals for Student Profile:

- Shift to the Washington 2+2 model and actively recruit students interested in the community college experience.
- Raise the average GPA to 3.25
- Increase the completion of Lane degrees to 50%.

### TIPS FOR FACULTY WORKING WITH INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International Students at Lane are all on F-1 nonimmigrant student visas.
- International Students must maintain 12 credits per term.
- International Programs offers a success program for international students that are struggling academically which includes:
  - Tutoring
  - Increased advising
  - Midterm progress reports with faculty.
