Revised meeting notes from April 28 and May 1 approved with limited consensus.

# **Executive Team Budget Proposals**

Excepting line items IS9, IS23, IS24, IS57, IS68, IS78, IS82, IS108-109, IS130, IS133, IS137, C024, ES3, and ES5, college council approves the ET budget proposal with limited consensus. (vote: 6 yes, 3 will accept)

### **IS9** Arts Division

ET Proposal - 1.0 reduction in support (vote: 3 yes, 3 will accept, 2 no, 2 abstentions) (fails)

OISS supports a partial reinstatement to .5. (vote: 5 yes, 2 will accept, 2 no) (fails)

The department proposal is to eliminate the fibers and gallery management offerings and reinstate the position to 1.0.

(vote: 1 yes, 4 will accept, 3 no) (fails)

Barnum arrived at this point (4:30pm) so the total vote count changes from nine to ten.

## **IS23** Family & Health Careers, Early Childhood Education

ET Proposal - Reduce ECE and Child Development Center budgets by \$100,000. College Council approves this proposal (including a flexible June 30 deadline) with limited consensus.

(vote: 8 yes, 2 will accept)

### **IS57** Business Development Center

ET Proposal - Restructure the Small Business and Farm Management programs from full-year to nine-month programs. Faculty overload would be eliminated. (vote: 7 yes, 2 will accept, 1 no) (fails)

The LCCEA is concerned about the impact of the proposed cut on the program viability and net revenues for the college.

## **IS68** Conference & Culinary Services

ET Proposal - Close Food Services from August 11 to September 11. **College Council approves this proposal with limited consensus**. (vote: 9 yes, 1 will accept)

# IS78 English as a Second Language

ET Proposal - .08 FTE reduction in student services support OISS supports the ESL proposal to reduce non-unit classified and part-time instruction in lieu of reducing the 1.0 position to .917. With the caveat that support will be withdrawn if FTE does not increase as planned, College Council approves this proposal with limited consensus. (vote: 7 yes, 3 will accept)

# **IS82** Academic Learning Skills

ET Proposal - .50 FTE reduction in office support. (vote: 3 yes, 4 will accept, 2 no, 1 abstention) (fails)

OISS supports a partial reinstatement to .75. (vote: 7 yes, 2 will accept, 1 no) (fails)

The department proposal is to reduce the part-time instruction budget by an equivalent amount and reinstate the position to 1.0. (vote: 2 yes, 3 will accept, 5 no) (fails)

# **IS108-109** Library

ET Proposal - Reduce open hours, reference desk coverage, and backfill for release time.

College Council approves this proposal with limited consensus. (vote: 9 yes, 1 will accept)

## **IS130** Instruction

ET Proposal - Reduce by \$175,000, the budget for enrollment management used to fund needed extra sections.

The LCCEA is concerned that: a) any such cuts not be made if student demand would result in net revenues to the college, and b) if turning to use "tuition-based" funding, this is done consistently with current class size and workload practices.

College Council approves this proposal with limited consensus. (vote: 8 yes, 2 will accept)

### **IS133** Instruction

ET Proposal - Reduce faculty release time by \$150,000.

The LCCEA is concerned that: a) a 'one size fits all' approach that eliminates all lead instructor reassignment time is problematic; and b) if reassignment time is reduced or eliminated, there must be a corresponding reduction in associated duties.

College Council approves this proposal with limited consensus. (votes 9 yes, 1 will accept)

### **IS137** Instruction

ET Proposal - Reduce budget by \$352,000 by not filling faculty vacancies – backfill primarily with part-time faculty. **College Council approves this proposal unanimously.** 

# **CO24** Information Technology

ET Proposal - Phase out staff modem pool. College Council approves this proposal unanimously.

## **ES3** Human Resources

ET Proposal - Reduce Material & Services (including the methods of advertising for positions) budget by \$15,000. **College Council approves this proposal with limited consensus**. (vote: 9 yes, 1 will accept)

## **ES5** Governance

ET Proposal - Reduce budget for governance, board, & other administrative services by \$60,000.

(vote: 6 yes, 2 will accept, 2 no) (fails)

College Council amendment to classified union proposal - add \$8000 for student stipends. **College Council approves this proposal with limited consensus**. (vote: 7 yes, 2 will accept, 1 abstention)

LCCEF amended proposal - Reduce governance budget to \$18,000 (8000 for student stipends)

(vote; 2 yes, 6 no, 1 will accept, 1 abstention) (fails)

LCCEF proposal reduce the governance budget to zero by eliminating six of the seven governance councils. (vote: 1 yes, 8 no, 1 will accept) (fails)

**ASLCC** proposal to assess a one-time enrollment fee of \$30. Unused funds would be allocated to priority goals from the Student Affairs Strategic Plan. **College Council approves this proposal with limited consensus**. (vote: 6 yes, 2 will accept, 2 abstentions)

### **IS24** Family & Health Careers

ET Proposal - .70 FTE reduction in technology support. (vote: 4 yes, 3 will accept, 2 no) (fails)

OISS supports in concept the FHC proposal to redistribute funding sources to eliminate <u>a position</u> (not necessarily as outlined in the FHC proposal). (vote: 6 yes, 2 will accept, 1 no) (fails)

Department proposal to substitute a classified position for the Information Technology position. (vote: 2 yes, 5 will accept, 2 no) (fails)

College Council endorses the ET budget proposals except for IS9 (Arts), IS24 (FHC), IS57 (BDC), IS78 (ESL), IS82 (ALS), and ES5 (GOV).
