Agreed that Center Building remodel and several other maintenance projects must be completed. So setting aside certain things that were in the Master Planning process that involved reducing the size of the Center Building Building 17 (Forum) needs to be renovated but at a reduced cost recognizing that there needs to be theater rooms either in that building or another building.

	 ALS does developmental learning (versus basic skills) These are credit courses so they conform to the academic calendar and are eligible for financial aid ALS has grown a lot in the last few years and the pass rates are comparable with other credit classes. We don't have persistence information term to term yet. ESL program that allows international students and immigrant students to learn side by side. Challenge is to decide how best to develop these programs to allow success for students with different goals Have an advisor working with students in ABSE and ALS so that they can see what they might aim for
