Educational Resources implementation (Technology Council)	 accomplishments as of January 7, 2011, was handed out and reviewed. Discussed accomplishments and directions that might be explored to expand and improve the resources available to faculty, staff and students. This certainly is driven by resource availability and allocation decisions. OERs may have costs (for example the cost of students printing out hundreds of online pages) that are not necessarily being taken into account and there may need to be policies that address these costs and the technological demands that this creates for students.
