Justin, Sandin, and Alen will come prepared for the March 1 meeting with handouts of existing policies and their "first draft" of rewrites/suggestions/cleaning-up- the-language of these policies.	<ol> <li>Pruch sent regrets prior to the meeting.</li> <li>Guest Thad Cowdin addressed the council and fielded questions (see below)</li> <li>Minutes of February 1 meeting approved.</li> <li>Council members shared pertinent news items. Among them were:         <ul> <li>ASLCC will be using ExpressLane to survey students about their interest in possibly being provided with an LCC email address.</li> <li>LCC instructors will be reviewing four software packages for online instruction at Lane. Among the choices are WebCT, BlackBoard, Moodle, Sakai. The BlackBoard demonstration will be March 16<sup>th</sup> with more dates and notices to follow.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Committee discussed plans for next two meetings. Since March 1 meeting will have guest speakers, therefore cutting the length of the meeting time, the following was proposed.</li> <li>March 1 meeting – After guest speakers, committee will address the Remote Access, VPN, and Wireless policies. If time permits, Use of Services.</li> <li>March 15 meeting – Since no guest speaker is currently scheduled, committee will address the large issue of Appropriate Use.</li> </ol>
Joe and Don will prepare the same for the March 15 meeting on Appropriate Use.	Thad Cowdin presented information on the new Student Access Network (SAN). Highlights include:
Mark Williams will email the council his template for policies	<ol> <li>Thad thanked the council for taking the important step to inform themselves on what is occurring with technology at Lane.</li> <li>Separate students subnet outside LCC firewall has been created, complete with authentication security scheme</li> <li>This network is for all students who have paid either the Technology Fee or Resource Fee.</li> <li>Once a student opens their browser, they will have to authenticate with L# and pin. This data and system is presently used by Instructional Computing Labs and is updated at the top of every hour.</li> <li>Locations for the network are many, including Health201 and the Cafeteria</li> <li>Project is currently in the testing phase in the CIT building</li> <li>Project is slated to roll out to the entire campus for the Spring 2005 term.</li> <li>SAN has a chartered team of volunteers who have an open committee. Their official charter includes being a temporary committee with and termination date of June 2005.</li> <li>Council members asked a large number of questions of the presenter on topics ranging from technical to support issues. General council sense was positive and that this project is a welcome addition for the students at Lane.</li> </ol>
