



The grade for Lane's Bi 231 is determined by averaging the UO ANAT 311 and 312 grades. If one grade is higher than the other - the higher-grade value is used for the Bi 231 grade at Lane.

The HPHY 313 grade is used to determine the BI 232 grade and the HPHY 314 grade is used to determine the BI 233 grade. The exception to this is when there is a two grade difference. For example if one grade is A and the other is C then the grade value of B is assigned to both Bi 232 and Bi 233.

This is because the UO students are required to take 20 credits to complete the AP sequence in contrast to the 12 credits that the Lane students are required to complete.

In order for students to receive the credit equivalent for Lane's Bi 231, 232 and 233 – UO students are required to complete two terms of ANAT and two terms of HPHY with their corresponding labs. For the purpose of determining point values for application only the grades for the theory courses will be utilized - as long as the lab grades are equivalent to a grade of C- or better.

For example if a UO student received the following grades ANAT 311 A; ANAT 312 B; HPHY 313 A; HPHY 314 C – the Lane grades to determine points would be Bi 231 A, BI 232 B and Bi 233 B.
