- You must create an account on campus. Once you create an account, you can access it from anywhere.



You can browse the full-text of the title for five minutes. When your five minutes of browsing has expired, you'll be asked to confirm that you want to borrow the book.




Click "Yes, borrow" if you'd like to continue **reading** the book, to **print** pages from the book, or **download** the book.

EBL ebook publishers allow up to 20% of a book to be printed.

Downloading EBL Books

EBL ebooks can be downloaded for reading offline for up to seven days. You'll find the download button for each book you are reading within the "Download" tab in the EBL Online Reader.




On your personal desktop or laptop, all downloaded ebooks are read via Adobe Digital Editions (ADE). **To successfully download titles, please ensure you have this free software installed before downloading:** <http://www.adobe.com/products/digitaleditions/#download>

Adobe Digital Editions (ADE) is a separate application from Adobe Acrobat and Adobe Reader, and was designed specifically for reading ebooks. In order to download and read EBL ebooks offline, you must **first** have ADE installed. You can download this software from the [ADE website](#).

If you are working on a computer that is shared by others (for example, a PC in your library or elsewhere on campus), you should always choose to read ebooks online.

Once created, your personal Adobe Digital Editions library will always indicate the length of your off-line access to a title and if access to any titles in your personal library have expired.



If you need additional offline access to an expired title, you may download the title again from the EBL Online Reader.

Ebook Readers

Downloaded EBL titles may also be transferred to ebook readers and mobile devices that support Adobe Digital Editions. You can check if your device supports ADE here: <http://blogs.adobe.com/digitalpublishing/supported-devices>. Via this URL you will also find links to each device's website, where you can find specific transfer instructions.

Additionally, you may download EBL titles directly to your **iPad**, **iPhone**, **iPad Touch** using the free **Bluefire** application: <http://www.bluefirereader.com/ipad.html>. Please note, to download titles to your iPad or iPhone you are still required to have an Adobe Digital Editions account.

*Note: Unfortunately **EBL ebooks cannot be downloaded to a Kindle**. Kindle does not support Adobe Digital Editions.*

Email, Print and Export Your Collections



Online Bookmarks (Notes)

When reading an EBL title online you can create notes against individual pages within an ebook. Notes are often referred to as “Bookmarks” within the EBL interface. EBL will automatically save your online Bookmarks, so the notes may be accessed on later sessions. All of your EBL activities, including Bookmarks, are private.


To create a Bookmark in the online reader, click the Notes tab to the left of your active page. Then, enter a title and contents for your Bookmark. You can also copy and paste text from the ebook into the note:




Once you create a Bookmark in the online reader it is automatically saved. You can then access it in the current or later sessions from the Notes tab in the EBL Online Reader, the Bookmarks tab on the detailed record for the title, and the Bookmarks link on the EBL home page:




The Bookmarks link on the EBL home page will access all of your EBL Bookmarks:




If you click on the Bookmark title or page number, you will access the full text of a note. If you click on the link adjacent to the Bookmark text, you will navigate to that page within the ebook:



You can also export your EBL Bookmarks in text format or formatting compatible with Refworks® or Endnote®. To export, simply click on the “export” link and choose your format:
