**Professional Development:**

Thursday, March 10, 2011, 3-5 pm "Tea and Topics" faculty conversation. Topic: "Writing Across the Curriculum." Faculty from Art, Business, English, Counseling, Library, Academic Learning Skills discussed how to embed writing assignments into courses, challenges of doing so etc. This is a precursor to a proposed Spring Conference session led by Lane's Composition Coordinator.

March 11, 2011, all day – Hosted a technology conference, iLane 2.0, to encourage faculty to consider how to use technology to innovate their courses. Approximately 150 attending participants and tracked more than 200 hits on our live video stream! Brian Lamb, keynote presenter, also took us live on ds106 radio in the afternoon where faculty and technologists from institutions across the country tuned-in to Lane Community College and our discussion on digital storytelling, copyright, and OER. Doing a quick Twitter search produced a number of colleagues around the country 'tweeting' about iLane during the broadcast. Our reach on this day quite simply demonstrates the potential of technology to build community, educate, and create connections. This was new-media in action.
