INITIATIVE TITLE: Leadership Institute

DESCRIPTION: Students involved in LCC student government groups need to develop leadership skills and a course has been designed to get the skills outlined in the Phi Theta Kappa leadership training. This course is being offered in Summer Term of 2004. We would like to expand on this initial course with an initiative to create a 2-3 day Leadership Institute that would serve a broader audience in Lane County. The institute would be offered during the summer of 2005, on Main Campus. Lane County community businesses and organizations would be the target audience. This has the potential to serve a large group of persons. This would be developed in concert with BWEL. Further down the road, we would like to expand the leadership course/institute concept to include a curriculum aimed at Lane County high school student leaders. This step would take a much wider coordinating effort and this next year will most likely be spent in making the connections with high schools and exploring the concept further with them.

RESOURCES NEEDED: 50 hours of curriculum development would be needed to develop the 2-3 day community based leadership institute. 50 hours @ \$25 = \$1,250.

FUNDING SOURCES: Curriculum Development funds.
