The Hands-On Careers Exploration Day, formerly called the Professional Technical Careers Exploration Day, supports the college's efforts to increase enrollment with innovative recruitment strategies.

2. Describe the initiative

Hands-On Careers Exploration Day is a half-day workshop that allows Lane county high school students to come on campus and do a hands-on learning activity in a career area of their choice. Current Lane students serve as mentors and facilitators during the day. The purpose is to expose high school students to technical careers and to motivate them to pursue higher education. It has been an annual event for three years and there is an extremely high interest on the part of the college and the high schools to continue it.

- How does this initiative align with the college priorities?
 Hands-On Careers Exploration Day bolsters our positive and established relationship with the K-12 educational system and aims to increase credit enrollment, both of which are college priorities.
- What will the product, innovation, or change of this initiative be? Please be as specific as possible.
 - The product of this initiative will be better informed high school students who are excited to attend Lane Community College.
