Coop Ed 2008-09 Initiative: New Occupational and Employment Skills Training Programs

Summary:

Student support for the Occupational Skills/Employment Skills training program through a student advisor.

Description:

OST/EST is a CTE program which provides students with certificates through on the job experiences and course work. We would like to expand the use of the EST/OST program as part of Career Pathways to increase the number and types of career programs we can offer. Working with Continuing Education, our current co-op coordinators are expanding their roles to offer credit internships for students in new skill areas: Medical Receptionist, Music Thanatology, Pharmacy Technician, and Veterinary Technician began offering opporutnities for students in 2007-8. This will add even more students to the ones we have currently. These expanding programs will need student support for their success.

- 1. Expansion of the Occupational Skills Program has been a goal of Cooperative Education since our first unit plan. It is an area where we have been very successful in maintaining FTE and enrollment. As the career pathways movement becomes more visible these opportunities for students will expand and more students will participate increasing our FTE.

Describe the resources needed:

Because the Occupational Skills Program involves individual curriculum development for students, a student advisor is critical. The Student Advisor I salary for .49 FTE is \$18,298.90 + \$6,313.12 OPE. We are requesting these timesheet funds from the Carl Perkins grant.

What specific measurable program outcomes do you expect to achieve with this initiative? The outcomes should be specific enough to be measurable. Also, outline the method that will be used to determine the results.

We expect to increase enrollment by approximately 32 students, plus 119 credits of tuition yielding an estimate of 8.3 FTE. FTE total will generate approximately \$20,905 and tuition will bring in \$9,044. This initiative will also contribute to meeting the Carl Perkins performance measures for certificate completion and special population success.

The division currently has only one faculty coordinator to deal with Occupational Skills students. We have expanded the role of our current faculty in specific departments to add some of these students where appropriate. This makes the role of the student advisor even more central in dealing with student issues.

In the Carl Perkins grant students must achieve academic and technical skills that will insure successs in the workplace. Students in Occupational Skills will be learning these skills directly from employers at worksites based on industry standards.

How will funding this initiative increase or sustain the number of CTE students that graduate or receive a one year certificate from Lane and help prepare the students for employment?

All of the Occupational Skills students are CTE students who are placed in industry where they are trained. Since they are already working in industry, there is no closer tie to employment. Occupational Skills has a 75% hire rate at training site after completion of one-year program. Another 10% of the students are hired at competing employer sites for a 85% retention rate total.
