Florence 2008-09 Initiative: Health Career Pathways

Summary:

The Florence Center will continue to build its effort to provide professional technical health career pathways started in 2001.

Description:

The Florence Center is committed to further enhance our effort to provide professional tech instruction in the health care industry which started in 2001 in partnership with PeaceHealth Siuslaw Region.

In 2008-09 will expand our professional tech work by adding two significant partners, Southwest Oregon Community College and Linn-Benton Community College by offering a nursing program and Diagnostic Imaging at the Florence Center beginning in 2008. Students will be taking all their course work at the Florence Center.

This initiative not only benefits our students and Lane, but more importantly the community we serve.

Job targets for Lane County rate the health industry as one of it's most critical areas and this initiative meets this need.

Currently we offer pre-requisites for; HRT, nursing, Dental Hygiene, and Diagnostic Imaging. This initiative will require Carl Perkins funding which creates tutoring opportunities for our students.

Resources are needed to fund tutors for math, science, and medical courses which

represent pre-requisites for nursing, medical office assistant, health records technology, dental hygiene, and Diagnostic Imaging.

We have a growing number of students seeking careers in professional tech areas which puts an increasing demand on instructors and for tutors.

Math/Science/Family Health Occupations Tutor: \$14,000

Much of the success is a result of our tutoring program.

Employment

Due to our partnership with PeaceHealth Siuslaw Region we have been successful finding jobs for student at Peace Harbor Hospital. According to Vice-President of Human Resources, Don Bourland, the partnership created in 2001 "has created a steady flow of students/employees better prepared for employment due to our close work with the college".
