Library 2008-09 Initiative: Expand opportunities for information literacy

Summary:

Improve student preparedness for, and success: in making transition from high school, through transfer and CT programs at Lane, and in the workforce, through development of library instruction program in collaboration with program personnel and teaching faculty.

Description:

Improve student preparedness for, and success:

- In making transition from high school
 - Collaborate with high schools to develop information literacy program to ease transition to college-level coursework; pilot project at Cottage Grove and/or Florence high schools
 - Develop infolit placement test and companion tutorial to assure basic competencies prior to attempting college-level coursework (registration in library credit classes indicates a wide range of preparedness for basic college assignments)
 - Work with CG100 (College Success) instructors to include library component
 - Summer academy/library boot camp
 - Work with Regional Technical Education Consortium program to include library component
 - Develop online companion/tutorial for distance learning courses
 - Develop web pages that assist learners in finding resources most appropriate for course and/or discipline specific resources; i.e. LibGuides
- Through Transfer Programs at Lane
 - Develop comprehensive information literacy plan, which is appropriate to the mission of a community college, responsive to the direction adopted by the Joint Boards Articulation Commission, and adequately prepares Lane students for transfer to 4-year colleges or to the workforce.
 - Finalize and receive curriculum approval for one-credit library companion course to Writing classes (framework developed by library practicum student in winter and spring 2008.)
 - Develop optional infolit companion course to "track" syllabus of writing courses offered
 - Develop mission statement and service objectives for each work unit in the library; develop and/or revise policies that best support student retention and learning
 - o Investigate online tools to assist students e.g. NoodleBib
- Through Career and Technical Programs
 - Work with CTE faculty to identify specific "library" outcomes listed for each program; develop collection, course/program-specific web pages, tutorials, instruction, assignments, etc. to meet these unique outcomes

- Modify Library 127 and other library credit classes to meet degree approval requirements for inclusion in Arts and Humanities family.
- In the workforce
 - Develop tutorial/workshop emphasizing search strategies and resources to address workplace problems; part of Workforce Development efforts
 - Develop library center as part of bond planning for new Downtown Center

Assist teaching faculty in providing students with critical thinking and information synthesis skills, awareness of library resources

- Offer workshops for faculty and staff in use of specific library resources
- Make outreach to liaison faculty a priority
- Make personal contact with each new faculty member (including part-time) at least once per year
- Expand portfolio of "sample assignments"

• Continued subscription to LibGuide software. This software allows librarians to create course and discipline specific web pages to highlight appropriate library and web resources for use by students and faculty (\$1,000)

Part-time faculty

• 250 hours of part-time library faculty to work with CTE faculty to develop and implement program outcomes re information literacy and use of library resources (\$30 per hour)
