The instructors are working with the CTE Deans on the Statewide Manufacturing Core Skills Certificate. Lane is collaborating with Oregon Workforce Investment Board and a statewide steering committee of manufacturers. The Oregon Manufacturing Workforce Strategy is designed to connect the many initiatives and investments being made statewide to support a high-performance manufacturing economy. It will help to build competitive companies, fill the skilled-worker shortage and provide high-wage jobs for Oregonians. The initial work has been to identify existing classes that relate to the skill standards identified by industry. This work is on-going and will enhance the ability of Lane to increase enrollment in manufacturing skills-related programs in the future.
