Electronics Technology:

With the retirement and non-replacement of one full time faculty, an entire redesign of the program was necessary. They chose to incorporate some redesigned classes that fit the emerging needs of the Apprenticeship Program. The success of this strategy continues to challenge the ability to cope with a higher enrollment and fewer instructional resources.
