Adaptation of Nursing Curriculum to Online format

Summary:

Nursing faculty are working toward making all theory courses in the curriculum available on line. They have participated in the SIF Grant during tis academic year and plan to have Fall Term, First Year courses ready online in Fall of 2009.

Description

The following courses constitute the theory courses in the nursing curriculum: Fall Term, First Year: NRS 110A Foundations of Nursing - Health Promotion (NRS 110B is the accompanying Clinical Lab course) Winter Term, First Year: NRS 111A Foundations of Nursing in Chronic Illness I (NRS 111B is the accompanying Clinical Lab course) NRS 230 Clinical Pharmacology I NRS 232 Pathophysiology Processes I Spring Term, First Year: NRS 112A Foundations of Nursing in Acute Care (NRS 112B is the accompanying Clinical Lab course NRS 231 Clinical Pharmacology II NRS 233 Pathophysiology Processes II

These courses are planned to be offered in online format.

Work will continue on the theory courses in the second year of the curriculum upon completion of the first year.
