Summary:

Funding this initiative will increase the number of CTE students who graduate from Lane in that this PTA Program will potentially graduate 24 competent practitioners prepared for entry-level employment as physical therapist assistants.

Initiative Report for Health Professions 2009-10

Maintenance and Growth of the Respiratory Care Program

Summary:

The Respiratory Care Program has been mandated by the College to make all didactic courses available on line beginning in Fall, 2009. In addition, it is a goal of the division to maintain the program as one preparing graduates for entry-level positions in the health care industry.

Description

The mandate to revise the courses which comprise the didactic component of the Respiratory Program by Fall of 2009 requires that all didactic courses be available to students term-by-term. In addition the continued provision of on-campus lab learning for Lane students as well as any distance students from other schools is required. A significant amount of planning is required to create the necessary letters of agreement with other educational institutions with which Lane will create partnerships, to plan for and provide the on-campus lab experiences for local and distant students and to initiate and maintain the necessary clinical affiliations for students in both the clinical and cooperative education components. The two full-time and the three primary part-time faculty involved in this program are required to both develop and learn how to teach on line courses.

Maintenance of the Respiratory Care Program relative to providing the didactic and technical skills required for entry-level employment in the health care industry is a division goal.

Describe the resources needed:

The Respiratory Care Program is requesting 300 Hours of Curriculum Development funding through Carl Perkins and Curriculum Development Funding for the purpose of continuing the online adaptation of theory courses and the preparation of the full and part-time faculty to be able to teach the adapted courses.

The equipment needs for the Respiratory Care Program being requested through both Carl Perkins and the Tech Fee Funding are:

> Upgrade of Instructional Software to enhance student learning in Pediatric Care: PCS-03 Asthma, PCS-04 Bronchiolitis, PCS-05 CPR, PCS-06 Chest Trauma, PCS-10 Muscular Dystrophy, PCS-12 Pediatric Transport, PCS-13 Respiratory Distress Syndrome, PCS-14 Status Asthmaticus, PCS-Poxic Substance Ingestion at a cost of \$4005.00 which includes the Site License.

> One LifeForm Auscultation Trainer (Providing students experience in learning proper techniques for listening to breath sounds and differentiating between normal and abnormal sounds) at a cost of \$2600.00.

> One NND EasyOne Spirometer (Providing students the opportunity to learn basic pulmonary function assessment. The purchase of this item will increase student/equipment ratio to one-to-six instead of one-to-twelve, allowing students increased learning time) at a cost of \$1790.00

> Upgrade of Instructional Software to enhance student learning in Pediatric Respiratory Care (MES-01 Arterial Blood Gases I, MES-21 Arterial Blood Gases II, MES-04 ElectroCardiogram II, MES-09 Chest Tubes, MES-11 Complete Chest Exam, OST-02"Team Play Arterial Blood Gases at a cost of \$2495.00 which includes Site License.

>Two each Posey Cufflator/Standard (Equipment used to monitor and regulate air pressure in the ET tube cuffs. Will allow students to practice in the lab with the same equipment as is used at the clinical sites) at a cost of \$700.00.

What specific measurable program outcomes do you expect to achieve with this initiative? The outcomes should be specific enough to be measurable. Also, outline the method that will be used to determine the results.

We expect to continue to achieve the program outcomes: The graduate will:

> provide treatment, management, control and care of patients with deficiencies and abnormalities associated with respiration.

> provide patients with therapeutic use of medical gases, air and oxygen administering apparatus.

> appropriately use environmental control systems, humidification and aerosols, medications and ventilatory control.

> supervise postural drainage, chest physiotherapy and breathing exercises.

> perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and measure and maintain natural, artificial and mechanical airways.

> use appropriate library and information resources to research professional issues and support lifelong learning.

> formulate questions that can be addressed with data and collect, organize and present relevant data to answer them.

These outcomes are measured by question/answer tests and by criteria-focused grading of student return demonstrations.

While the curriculum revision will focus on adaptation of courses to online format and hybrid format, there will be some need for revision of on-campus lab packets and demonstration materials.

While courses RT 112, RT 114, and RT 146 must be ready to be provided on line in Fall Term 2009, the adaptation of the courses RT 116, RT 127, and RT 144 will need to be ready for Winter Term 2010, and RT 254 and RT 126 will need to be ready by Spring Term, 2010 and RT 110 and RT 136 will need to be ready for Summer Term, 2010. This is the only opportunity to request curriculum development funds for that time period. It is anticipated that the SIF grant will continue to fund a portion of this effort.

This is a College-mandated activity.

The general division instructional goal that is being met, however, is the maintenance of the health care programs at a level which will provide graduates with entry-level skills for employment in health care facilities in the community.

Initiative Report for Health Professions 2009-10

Maintenance and Growth of Medical Assisting Program

Summary:

The Medical Assisting Program offers day and evening options for students and has increased the number of graduates over the past two years. Maintenance of state-of-the-art equipment is required given the increased number of students using equipment in the on-campus lab setting.

Description

The clinical component of the Medical Assisting Program is limited by accreditation requirements to fifteen students. Medical Assisting currently offers three clinical sections, two during the day and one in the evening and has increased the number of students using the clinical equipment. The growth of this program has resulted in needing to offer additional sections of program courses to accommodate students and the M&S costs have increased commensurately. In order to maintain and support program growth, equipment for on-campus labs is experiencing heavier use. The need for equipment replacement being requested is directly related to that growth in the number of students.

With the addition of the Nasco Code 12-Lead Arrhythmia, students will be able to learn how to identify cardiac arrhythmias and how to intervene using a prescribed protocol. Students will be checked off on these skills using written grading criteria.
