Initiative Report for Social Science 2009-10

Hybrid Curriculum Development - Geography

Summary:

This request is for 60 hours of curriculum development money to develop two hybrid courses in geography - Geog141 Natural Environment and Geog 142 Human Geography.

Description

Geog142 Natural Environment and Geog 142 Human Geography were elevated from three to four credit classes to match the credit offering at the UO with no curriculum development money. However, increasing the credits made it difficult to offer them as night classes. Students are reluctant to take a four-hour once-a-week class and offering the class two nights a week reduces other class opportunities for students. The hybrid model is ideal for this situation. Students will have important class time with the instructor and have flexible time to complete course work. Retention, will improve given that students will have time to discuss difficult concepts and ideas. The hybrid will use online aspects to gain important academic content and technological skills.
