## **Initiative Report for Social Science 2009-10**

### **Mental Health Associate**

#### **Summary:**

Development of a curriculum and Mental Health Certificate within the Human Services Program that would prepare students to work in the mental health field.

#### Description

A new 300 plus bed mental health hospital is being built in Junction City. This facility will require staffing. Additionally, there are a number of local agencies that provide residential and case management services to persons with mental illnesses and these programs will likely increase as patients get released back into Lane County for community services and support to prevent further hospitalization. The intent of this initiative is to work with the state mental health Division and other community college faculty to develop a state-wide curriculum for mental health associates.

This initiative is not linked directly to last years initiative. It is related to providing educational experiences that prepare students for new careers in human services.

#### Describe the resources needed:

This initiative is requesting curriculum development funding from Carl Perkins to support the development of a new concentration area and certificate in mental health. There is a state behavioral health workforce development committee that is currently assessing the competencies required for workers at this level. Curriculum development funds will be used for this program development and also to develop the classes once the competencies are identified.

#### **Curriculum Development**

- 300 hours of curriculum development to develop 3 classes (HS Diagnosis and Treatment: Clinical Disorders, HS Intervention I: Illness Management and Recovery, HS Intervention II: Illness Management and Recovery)
- 100 hours of curriculum development to work with the state to determine the subset of content that Lane should be teaching and the developing of the certificate to add to the Human Services program.

- 3 trips to Portland (\$365 mileage and meals)

#### **Program Development**

- In coordination with the State Mental Health Division, the state behavioral health workforce development committee, and other community colleges, develop a standardized curriculum to meet the needs of state and local mental health agencies and the state hospital.
- Work with the Lane County Mental Health Division to delineate a career path and requirements for students to become certified as a Qualified Mental Health Associate.

#### **Curriculum Development**

• Develop three courses to be delivered in 2010-2011 that reflect the competencies identified by the State Mental Health Division.
