Accomplishment Description:

Construction/Manufacturing Summer Youth Career Academy

A total of 23 youth participated in a seven-week summer academy that ran from July 7 through August 27, 2009. The at-risk youth, between the ages of 16 and 24, earned college credits by taking the 'Introduction to Trade Skills Fundamental' course. In addition, the students gained hands-on construction and manufacturing skills in a lab setting and then applied their skills through a paid work experience in the community and on Lane's main campus.

This summer youth academy, along with two other academies in healthcare and clean/green technology, was made possible through an American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) grant from Lane Workforce Partnership.
