Accomplishment Description:

Health Informatics Program

An articulation agreement was negotiated with Oregon Institute of Technology (OIT) for a degree in Health Informatics which resulted in a two year transfer program of studies in Health Informatics beginning in the 2009/2010 academic year. CIT faculty are also active partners in the consortium establishing a state-wide, two year, Health Informatics Technician associate degree.
