Accomplishment Description:

Increased Online Course Offerings

The Business department continued to expand its hybrid and online offerings, including: BA195 Service & Ethics in Business, BA206 Management Fundamentals, BA215 Accounting: Language of Business Decisions, BA217 Budgeting for Managers, BA278 Leadership & Team Development, BT113 QuickBooks, BT146 Team Building Skills, BT217 MS EXCEL for Business - Expert, LGL201 Legal Procedures 1, LGL202 Legal Procedures 2, and LGL203 Legal Procedures 3, which were all offered online for the first time in 2008-2009. We now have only 6 (of 51) courses that have not been developed online, including: BT020 10-Key Calculator, BT144 Administrative Procedures, BT180 Business Proofreading & Editing, BT243 Document Formatting, BT248 Integrated Office Systems, and BT263 Applied Financial Accounting.

The CIT department also continued to expand its hybrid and online offerings, including: CIS102 Problem Solving with Computers, CIS125G Software Tools 1: Game Development, CIS125H Software Tools 1: XHTML, CIS125SL Introduction to Second Life (new course), CIS140 Op Environments: Managing Windows, CS133G Beginning Programming: C++ for Games, CS133JS Beg Programming: JavaScript, CS160 Orientation to Computer Science, CS179 Introduction to Computer Networks, and CS195 Web Development 1, and CS295 Web Development 2, which were all offered online or hybrid for the first time in 2008-2009. CIT also increased the number of hybrid courses that have video based lectures (using classroom time for hands-on activities in sections of CS284 and CIS227N.)
