### **Accomplishment Description:**

#### **Accreditation Success**

This Accomplishment addresses the previously mentioned Accomplishment on Accreditation. After the successful completion of the submission of two separate Self Studys for the Culinary Arts and Hospitality Management Programs, and an evaluator on-site visit in May, 2009, both Programs were awarded with significant accreditations in July. ACPHA awarded the Hospitality Management Program with an initial 7-year accreditation. This is the first accredited Hospitality Management Program in Oregon. The ACFF awarded the Culinary Arts Program with a re-accreditation also for 7 years along with Exemplary Status honors. The joint accreditation for both programs has been a goal of the Division since the initial accreditation of the Culinary Arts Program in 2004. Lane will house the first joint accredited Culinary Arts and Hospitality Management Program in the Pacific Northwest
