Program, Curriculum, and Faculty/Student Success

100% student participation at the Local Food Connection a CML co-hosted event linking local farmers to local restaurants and institutions. Sold out Winter Classical Cuisine Dinner with 304 guests; smoothly executed dinner for both front and back-of-house. Spring Regional Cuisine Dinner highlighted the 100-Mile Meal concept of using local products within a 100-mile radius celebrating farmers, seasonal cooking, and sustainability. At least 30 guest speakers and lecturers visited Culinary Arts and Hospitality Management classes this year. A 2nd year culinary arts student was chosen for an Events and Planning Networking Conference Scholarship. Student Ambassadors participated in at least 5 off-campus Career Fairs and presented a seminar at the Home and Garden Show in coordination with the CML. Two 2nd year culinary arts students were assistants in the Joint Accreditation Self Study compilation.
