## **English Department Retreat**

#### Summary:

The English Department is experiencing a large number of externally-driven unfunded mandates at the same time the college is undergoing changes in budget, enrollments, and strategic directions. The department wants to meet to revision and align goals and strategies with the new reality that affects every aspect of worklife.

#### Description

Over the past few years, the English department has faced many changes that have been externally generated (revisions to the AA/OT, the call for Information Literacy within the composition series, etc.) and has had little opportunity to discuss the ramifications of these changes and/or the direction of the department (for instance, what new writing courses that we may need in response to changing business, community and educational directions [e.g., writing for the web, a course in new media to augment the film courses, additional technical writing offerings, etc.), or changes within composition studies (e.g., new pedagogical approaches to teaching writing, how assessment might augment and improve our writing sequence, etc.) We need an opportunity for the entire department to meet and discuss our future. Total Request: 4 hours X 55 faculty: 220 CD hours + \$250 for materials/refreshments (\$50 for photocopying + \$200 for food and beverages for the retreat)
