Accomplishment Description:

Career Pathways Certificates of Completion. Lane added additional career pathways certificates bringing the total available to 19, an increase of 7 from 2007-08. Lane also created 32 roadmaps, increasing the number from 30 the prior year. The goal is to create roadmaps for all career technical areas. Lane collaborated with South Lane School District to develop a sustainability career pathway. New articulated courses in sustainability and water conservations were developed. The Career Pathways Coordinator assisted Lane ESD develop HS Programs of Study in Drafting, MOA and Health Records Technolgy, ECE. High school teachers, Lane faculty/staff met to share information related to Carl Perkins and new diploma requirements, Oregon Skill Sets and student outcomes, student planning guides, course alignment and articulation, and career pathway roadmaps. In partnership with Lane ESD, Lane developed an online template that would interface thigh school career technical classes and programs with those at LCC. In addition, LCC and Lane ESD developed a local delivery assessment toll for ECE high school program.
