Expand Study Abroad Opportunities

Summary:

International Programs will enhance globalization of the college and support opportunities for American students to study abroad and create short term summer programs at Lane to generate revenue.

Description

International programs currently supports the Costa Rica faculty led program and is supporting the Intercultural Communication and French Faculty in developing affordable short term programs. Lane is working with Youngnam Foreign Languages college to create a sister college relationship and possibly provide a summer program for their students as well as other international students.

Currently through our budget we are dedicating about \$6,000 to developing these programs.

Began building relationship for this program in 2008, continuous planning since then. Over the summer and Fall of 2012 revise syllabi and course goals and run the course beginning in Spring 2012.

Expanded Study Abroad opportunities, enhanced retention, and building a more inclusive and diverse community.

Summer Program in France: This course creation will create opportunities for French faculty to teach this course and the Spanish faculty the opportunity to revise it and use it in a Spanish speaking country of their choice.

Summer Program in France: Each time the course is taught 15-20 students will benefit. If the course continues for the next 10 years then 150-200 students will benefit.

Speech 115: Each time the course is taught 20-25 students will benefit. If the course continues for the next 10 years then 200-250 students will benefit.

Summer Program in France:

Students will learn deeply about French culture and language and have an opportunity to learn in a rich cultural situation in which they will hear and converse with native speakers daily. Students will learn deeply and in real ways about intercultural communication and have the richest possible laboratory by being in a completely new culture and environment. They will learn not only about the theory of intercultural learning but actually apply it. In addition, research from the University of Minnesota and the University of Georgia shows higher graduation rates amongst students who study abroad.
