Academic Technology Communities

Summary:

Blogging Community

Academic Technology will implement a campus blogging community to facilitate open communication, innovation, and resource sharing among faculty staff and departments. The community will reside under <http://blogs.lanecc.edu> and will be used for online instruction, peer collaboration, and portfolio testing.

Digital Learning Communities

Academic Technology will explore the idea of a Learning Community for online students. In this scenario, a cadre of students may meet in a hybrid format - both online and face to face - and may be provisioned a virtual meeting space as well as iPads to facilitate the digital student experience.

Description

In the spirit of community, Academic Technology is hoping to institute a Blogging Community and a Digital Learning Community at Lane to facilitate open communication, resource and information sharing, and the cultivation of new ideas for Lane's students, faculty, and staff.

These communities will help all of us at Lane to increase our level of knowledge, understanding of other areas of the college, and ultimately help us all to produce better results in whatever endeavors we are involved in..
