Summary:

Description

"Project Library Uplift" is an effort to use minimal funds to transform limited areas of the library into a more inhabitable study environment. We will replace worn furniture with new and create a few "living room" areas. Over the summer we plan to continue changing furniture arrangements to allow better traffic flow and to integrate services into fewer access points. All these changes anticipate the Learning Commons.
