Elizabeth Woody is a member of the Warm Springs Tribe. She is an accomplished poet, essayist, artist, and Director of the Indigenous Leadership Program at Ecotrust in Portland. She'll be reading from her work and speaking to this year's Reading Together theme, *Circling Home: Stories and Sustainable Communities*, bringing the values of her cultural context to bear on the theme. She'll share her sense of what constitutes a sustainable community, conceptualizing sustainable community in a very large and whole sense—social (including spiritual, political, cultural, historical concerns) and ecological—especially the interconnected relationships between these arenas. She'll consider the role that story plays in this process.
