Dan O'Brien, author of the 2006-07 Reading Together book selection, *Buffalo for the Broken Heart*, is a two-time winner of both the National Endowment for the Arts individual artist's grant and the Western Heritage Award. *Buffalo for the Broken Heart* describes his ranch's conversion from cattle to buffalo, but even more centrally, O'Brien explores the nature of change and the transformation of his land and life. He has been a wildlife biologist and rancher for more than thirty years, owner of the Wild Idea Buffalo Company, and one of the most celebrated falconers in America today. He was a prime mover in the restoration of Peregrine Falcons in the Rocky Mountains. He is the author of five novels and three memoirs.
