





- 3 Completers are 'concentrators' who have earned an award during the year.
- Completion Rate is the number of grads divided by the number of 'concentrators.'
- 4 Minority is the number of self-declared minorities divided by the number of known ethnicities.
- 5 Special Populations are disabled, academically or economically disadvantaged, or of limited English proficiency.
- 6 Satisfactory Progress means maintaining a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA.

Persistence Rates



First-Time, Full-Time, 2-Year Degree-Seeking Students

A cohort is defined as first-time full-time degree-seeking students who started at Lane in the fall of a particular year and are tracked through time. College Now students are counted as first-time when they are no longer College Now students.

Example:

For AAOT majors, 299 (56%) of the 537 Fall 2004 Cohort were enrolled in any class in the second year.

For AAOT majors, 196 (36%) of the 537 Fall 2004 Cohort were enrolled in any class in the third year.

For AAOT majors, 22 of the 537 Fall 2004 Cohort earned a certificate or degree during the third year.

For AAOT majors, a cumulative total of 26 (4.8%) of the 537 Fall 2004 Cohort earned a certificate or degree by the end of the third year.
