



NOTE 1: In general, non-credit students are not asked about their main reasons for attending Lane.







Example:

For AAOT majors, 169 (39%) of the 435 Fall 2005 Cohort were enrolled in any class in the third year. For AAOT majors, 16 of the 435 Fall 2005 Cohort earned a certificate or degree during the third year.
