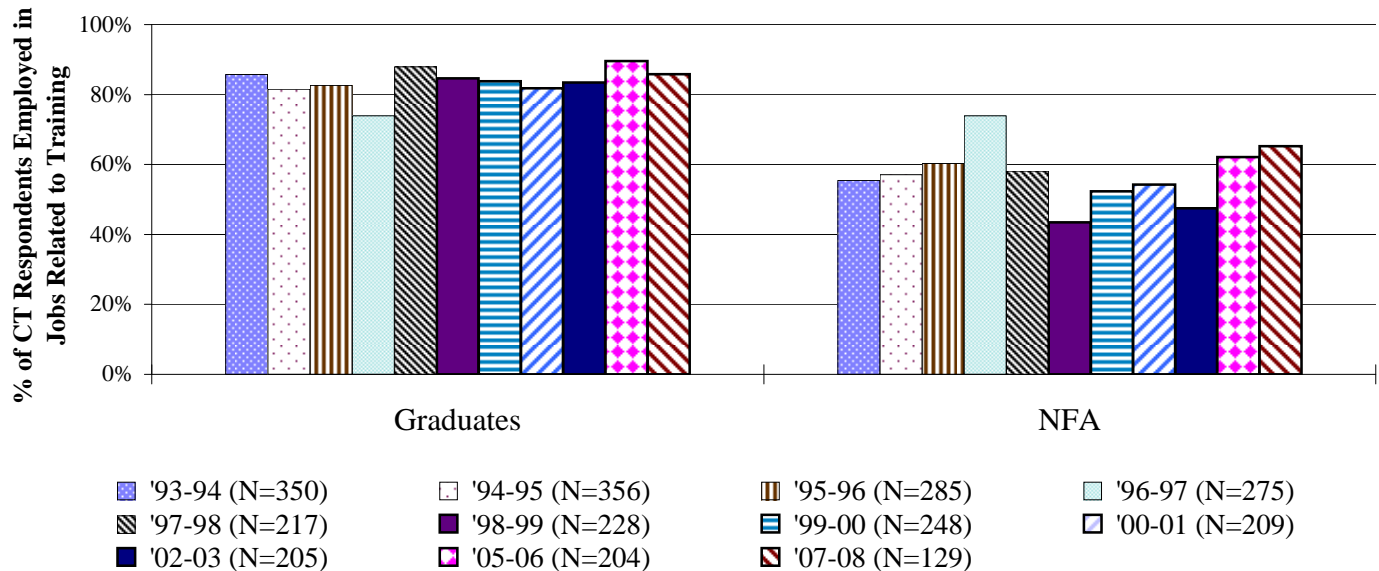


Key Benchmarks -- LANE Community College

Employment of Career Technical Students in Jobs Related to Their Training



◆ Lane's follow-up studies reveal that career technical graduates are more likely to be employed in jobs related to their Lane training than are students who did not earn a degree or certificate.

◆ For the eleven studies shown, an average of 84% of former career technical students who graduated were employed in jobs related to their Lane training, compared to 57% of former career technical students who did not graduate *.

Analysis and Action: One year after leaving Lane, former career technical students who reported they were employed are asked if their job is "related to your Lane program of study." Among 2007-08 employed career technical respondents, 86% of graduates and 65% of NFA respondents reported they were employed in jobs related to their field of study. Additionally, 79% of employed CT respondents reported they were not employed in their current job before attending Lane. We will continue to assess and track success of former Lane students in their workplaces.

* Lane's most recently conducted Annual Student Follow-up Survey contacted 2007-08 graduates and No Formal Award students (students who earned 60 or more credits at Lane and were enrolled full time for at least one term, did not earn a degree or certificate and did not return to Lane for fall term 2008). Students were surveyed one year after leaving Lane (i.e., spring term 2009 for '07-08 students).
