◆ During fall 2009, 20% (N = 654) of the 3,277 Lane County high school students who earned a diploma in 2007-08 were enrolled in Lane credit classes. Overall, there were 1,068 recent high school grads enrolled fall '08.

Analysis and Action: Following a November 2003 strategic conversation between Lane's Board and superintendents and principals from high schools across Lane's service district, Lane adopted a priority of improving connections between high schools and the college. A number of specific initiatives have been developed from this priority including: redirecting existing resources to create the High School Connections program; expanding College Now; developing the Regional Technology Education Consortium (RTEC) and Expanded Options which continue to solidify and grow with nearly 100 students enrolled in classes in '08-09, including college-level classes provided at high school sites in EMT Basic, Trades Skills Fundamentals and Theatre Arts.

Note: GED completers, home schooled youth, honorary diplomas, and modified diplomas are not included in this report.
