
Key Performance Measures -- Oregon Community Colleges

ODCCWD KPM #15: Progress of Transfer Students: Percentage of Community College Students Who Transfer to OUS and Return for Second Year



◆ This Oregon Community College Key Performance Measure is associated with Oregon Benchmarks #26 -- College Completion: Percent of Oregon Adults (25+) who have completed a bachelor's degree or advanced degree.

Analysis and Action: The percent of Oregon community college students who transferred to an OUS institution and then returned for a second year ranged from 76% to 80% for the three years reported. The percent of Lane's transfer cohorts who returned ranged from 81.5% to 84%. Lane's federally funded TRiO program has a goal of helping students stay in school and successfully graduate from Lane and/or transfer to a four-year institution. Lane is currently researching opportunities to pursue grant funds expected to be available through the American Graduation Initiative (AGI), a \$12 billion federal investment to substantially expand the capacity of the nation's community college system.

NOTES: For ODCCWD KPM #15, the measure is the percentage of community college lower division collegiate students who had earned 12 or more cumulative community college credits by the end of year 1, who were then admitted to and enrolled in an OUS institution in year 2, and who returned to OUS in year 3 (the reporting year).
