

Analysis and Action: For fall term 2009:

- > The average age of credit students was 27.4 years (compared to 26.8 years for fall 2003).
- The average age of non-credit students was 44.9 years (compared to 44.4 years for fall 2003). >
- The average age for all students was 33.1 years (compared to 33.8 years for fall 2003). >
- 38% of credit students were 21 years or younger (compared to 43% for fall 2003). >

Based on all the students who enrolled in fall '09 credit classes, the percent of students 21 years or younger decreased from 46% in fall '08 to 38% in fall '09; the percent of students 22 to 40 years increased from 38% in fall '08 to 46% in fall '09. We are continuing to analyze enrollment data to understand how they are affected by college policies and procedures.
