
## Key Benchmarks -- LANE Community College

## **Credit Students: Gender and Enrollment Status**

Fall Terms



## **Analysis and Action:** For fall term 2007:

- > 41.1% of all Lane credit students were enrolled full-time (12+ credits), compared to 46.3% fall 1988.
- > 44.6% of credit students were male, compared to 45.5% fall 1988.
  - \* 19.4% of credit students were males enrolled full-time (compared to 22.8% fall 1988).
- > 55.4% of credit students were female, compared to 54.5% fall 1988.
  - \* 21.7% of credit students were females enrolled full-time (compared to 23.5% fall 1988).

Comparing enrollment data for fall 2007 with fall 1988: 1) the total number of students enrolled in credit classes increased 40% -- from 7,668 students fall '88 to 10,710 students fall '07; 2) the percent of males and females enrolled has not changed substantially, but 3) the percent of part-time students has increased slightly. An important factor in the increase in part-time students is the growth in College Now enrollments.
