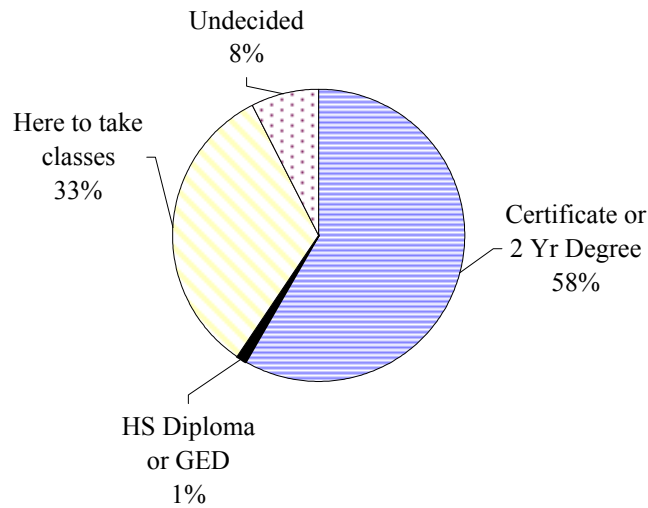

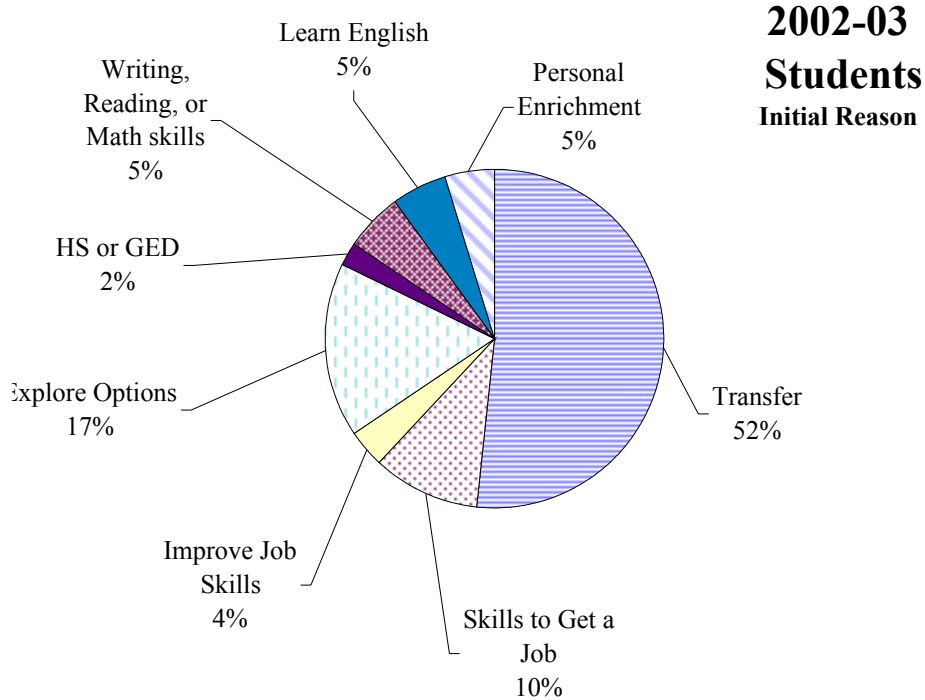

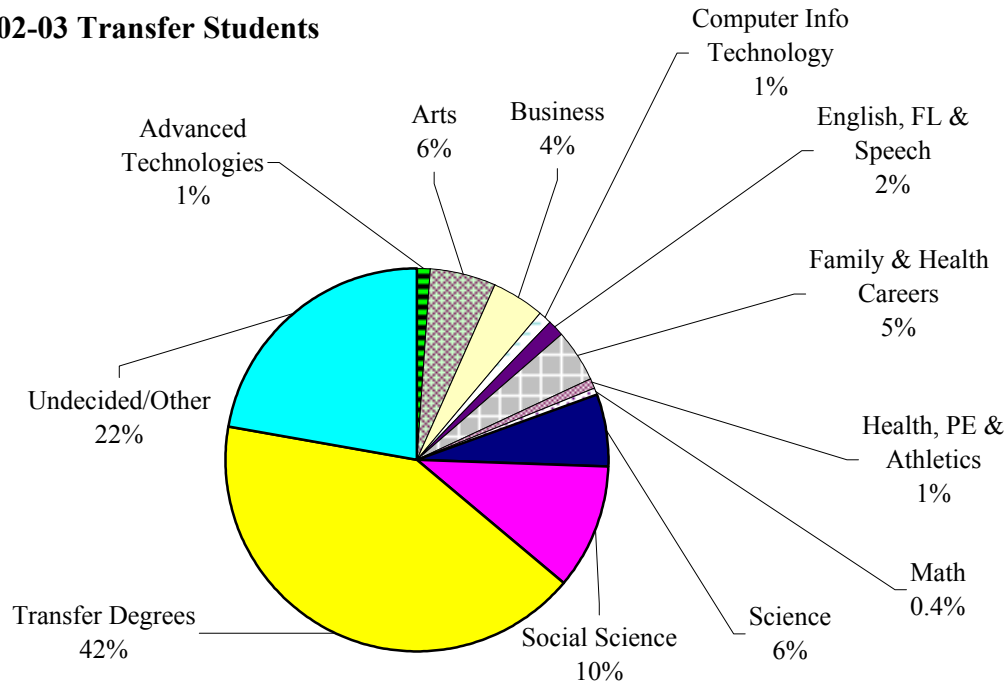

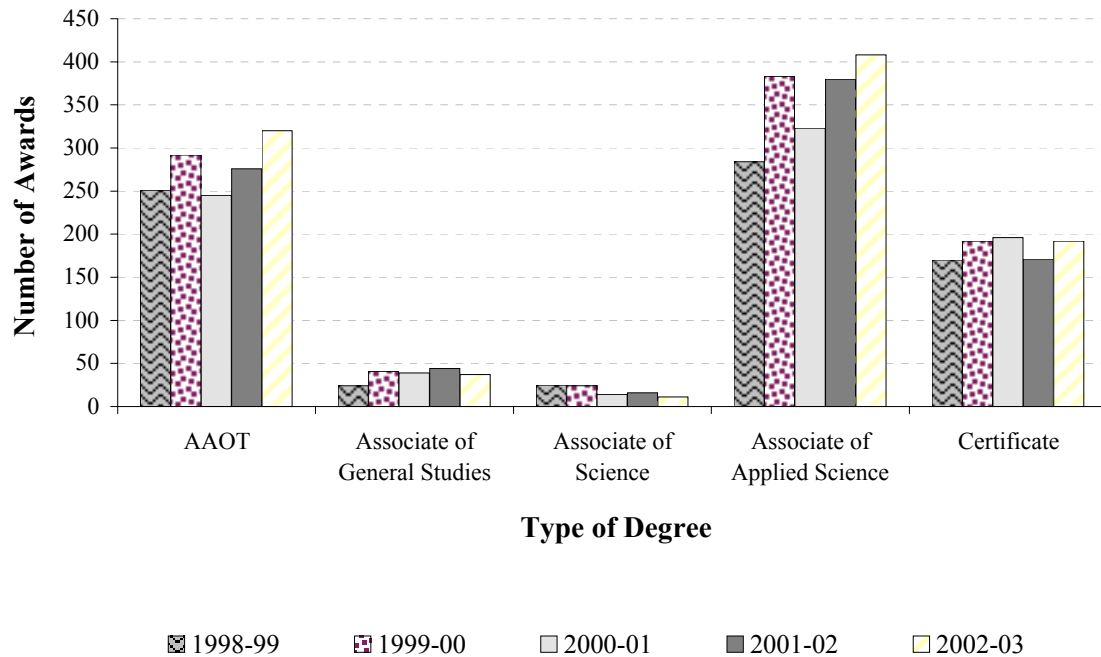

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Standards & Measures for Professional Technical Programs

Professional technical programs receiving funding from the Carl D. Perkins Act report student outcomes such as gender equity, satisfactory progress, program completion, employment, and further education. Since Perkins eligibility is based on a specific set of criteria, these data do not correspond to the number of students reported in other pages of this report.

Example: In Fall 2002, of the core professional technical certificate majors who had 25+ cumulated program credits prior to Fall 2002, 159 of the 249 (63.9%) earned an award during 2002-2003.

In Fall 2002, of the core professional technical degree majors who had 45+ cumulated program credits prior to Fall 2002, 206 of the 525 (39.2%) earned an award during 2002-2003.

1 - Total Enrollment Total Enrollment is the number of students with declared professional technical majors who had earned 6+ CORE and 6+ PROGRAM credits toward their declared majors. Core credits are credits that are earned in required courses in the professional technical program indicated by the student's major.

2 - Minority is the number of self-declared minorities divided by the number of known ethnicities. Unknown ethnicities are not included in the calculation.

3 - Special Population Enrollment is the unduplicated number of Perkins eligible students who are disabled, academically or economically disadvantaged, or of limited English proficiency.

4 - Satisfactory Progress means maintaining a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA.

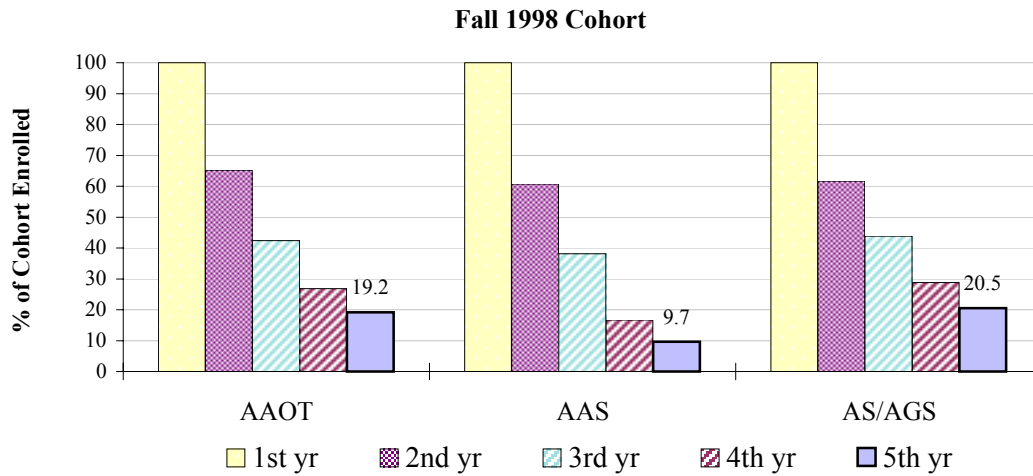
5 - Completion Rate--The base is the number of Fall 2002 professional technical core students who had earned 25 cumulated credits toward a certificate or 45 cumulated credits (approximately half of the credits required) toward a degree prior to the start of Fall 2002.

The completion rate is the number of the base who earned an award during 2002-03 divided by the base.

Note: At press time, employment and further education information was unavailable for 2002-03 students.

Persistence Rates

First-Time, Full-Time, 2-Year Degree-Seeking Students



A cohort is defined as first-time full-time degree-seeking students who started at Lane in the fall of a particular year and are tracked through time.

Example:

For AAOT majors, 180 (65.2%) of the 276 Fall 1998 Cohort were enrolled in any class in the second year.

For AAOT majors, 53 (19.2%) of the 276 Fall 1998 Cohort were enrolled in any class in the fifth year.

For AAOT majors, 7 of the 276 Fall 1998 Cohort earned a certificate or degree during the fifth year.

For AAOT majors, a cumulative total of 53 (19.2%) of the 276 Fall 1998 Cohort earned a certificate or degree by the end of the fifth year.
