#### General Eligibility

Contestant must be a Fall '09 or Spring '10 student in enrolled for credit in a League for Innovation - Fic Institution. Local coordinator must verify academic enrollment. Entries must be original works written during student's enrollment in credit courses at the college. Each entry must have a signature of a sponsoring faculty member.

#### Entry Requirements

Entries must be submitted in TWO forms:

- 1. PRINTED: Typed hard copy, double-spaced on 8.5 x 11 inch white paper with your name/contact information.
- 2. DIGITAL: An electronic copy submitted on CD. Disc should contain only the entry files.

A cover page for each entry must include:

- Author's name
- Home address and phone number
- Institution
- Title of entry
- Author's ID# (school acronym & genre, i.e: lcc-fiction)

Include in upper right corner of each entry page:

- Title of entry
- Author's ID# (school acronym & genre, i.e: lcc-fiction)
- Page number

Maximum Length Requirements:

- Poem must not exceed 67 lines.
- Personal essay must not exceed 2,000 words.
- One-Act play must not exceed 3,000 words,
- including stage directions/production notes. - Fiction must not exceed 3,000 words.

In each category, the judge is a nationally recognized writer. Judges' decisions are final.
