Certified Nursing Assistant – Acute Care (CNA 2) Training Fall Term 2011

Training will begin during the week of September 26, 2011. Additional details will be provided later. Location: Lane Community College - Downtown Center

A CNA 2 is trained to assist licensed nursing personnel in providing nursing care to patients. The goal is to provide opportunities for client independence and to promote positive healing. Additionally, a CNA 2 is expected to model correct methods of patient care to peers.

This is a six-week training that consists of 48 classroom hours and 25 clinical hours. By Oregon State Board of Nursing regulations, the course is restricted to those who hold a current, unencumbered Oregon CNA 1 certificate and have their name listed on the CNA Registry. To be successful in the training, potential students should have a minimum of six months work experience as a CNA 1.

Eligibility, Prerequisites, and Application Requirements

Eligibility:

- 1. Register with WorkSource Lane at either:
 - Lane Community College, Bldg. 19, Room 266

OR

- Oakmont Site, 2510 Oakmont Way

Please bring documentation that can be used to validate your birth date.

- 2. Must be an adult, 18 years of age or older.
- 3. Must be a Dislocated Worker or a Low-Income Adult as determined by WorkSource registration (Step #1) and/or in need of updated training related to the healthcare industry.
- 4. Must demonstrate eligibility to be employed in the U.S. by providing acceptable documents (driver license, passport, social security card, etc.).
- 5. Priority is given to veterans and eligible spouses.
- 6. Six months of prior employment as a CNA1 is highly recommended.

7. Must have a clean criminal history. Upon acceptance into the CNA training, must be able to pass a background check at the beginning of training. A prior felony conviction of any type, or a misdemeanor for drug, alcohol, or assault may disqualify you from working in the healthcare field.

Prerequisites To Be Completed Before Submitting Application:

- 1. Must complete the WIN Basic Skill Assessment with scores of 4 or higher. Higher scores may be awarded more points in the screening process.
- 2. Must complete the iMatch Skills Summary (see WorkSource staff for assistance).
- 3. Must participate in the Brighter Futures Project and complete the Career Mapping Checklist (see WorkSource Lane workshop calendar for orientation dates and times).
- 4. Must complete the National Career Readiness Certificate (see WorkSource Lane or Oakmont workshop calendars for orientation dates and times).
- 5. Must not have any holds on accounts at Lane Community College.

Requirements:

- 1. The purpose of this training is to prepare individuals for jobs. If you are not already employed, you will be provided with job search instruction and support as a part of the training, with the expectation that you will be seeking employment as soon as possible.
- 2. Upon acceptance into the training, each participant will sign a Statement of Responsibility, committing to fully engage in the CNA 2 training, become a member of a CNA 2 cohort (team), and fully participate in cohort activities planned by the Career Navigator.
- 3. Each participant must have an e-mail address and computer access. Communications with applicants and participants are conducted through e-mail. Please make sure you are frequently checking your e-mail for updates or notifications.
- 4. Participants may have to pay for the cost of required drug screening, at an estimated price of \$50.

What Should I Do If I am Interested?

- 1. Download the application packet and carefully review the eligibility requirements to make sure you qualify. For application packet, go to: <u>http://lanecc.edu/wdd/sponsoredshortterm.html</u>
- 2. Begin working on each of the prerequisites. Do not leave this until the last minute. It could take as long as 1-1/2 months or more to complete all of the prerequisites.
- 3. Complete the application packet and submit to WorkSource Lane, Lane Community College, 4000 East 30th Avenue, Room 260, Eugene, OR 97405.
